

This tournament will be flighted, as are all our other tournaments. Placing all players in different skill levels into flights, allows everyone to compete for gross and net prizes in each

flight. The competition for low gross is usually at the highest level of play, as the "A" players compete to become the overall club champion for low gross. The net champion could come from any of the other flights. As with all our major tournaments, we have a luncheon immediately following golf, at which a trophy is awarded. Needless to say we look forward to this tournament with excitement and anticipation.

The above are examples of our team games and major tournaments. Our weekly games consist of stroke play, either team or individual, with a net game usually built into each week along with the gross game. There are approximately 34 different games that we have scheduled for the 2023-2024 season. In addition to gross scores, we calculate net scores and use the net scores to determine winning individuals and winning teams. Some examples of our game inside our gross game are: only count net scores on holes that begin with T & F, we might throw out the holes that begin with "S" and count the other net scores, sometimes we'll count only two low net scores for each foursome. The format changes each week, making every week interesting and different. The games are always flighted; giving fair competition to all levels of players. Gross scores are recorded in the Golf Handicap Index Network (GHIN) and we use the net scores as a way to level the playing field to determine game winners.

Some outside opportunities are available through the LGA. The LGA participates in The Mid Florida Challenge Cup. The Mid Florida Challenge Cup involves seven golf clubs; Harbor Hills, Eagle Ridge, Monarch, Arlington Ridge, Plantation, Deer Island and Mt. Dora Country Club. It Begins in September and ends in April. It's a match play format with a partner and is played at the other clubs as well as at Harbor Hills

Every LGA player participates in a yearlong tournament where we keep track of every player's best scores on every hole, every week and report the best in each flight at the end of the year. Of course, any Eagles or Hole-In-Ones for the year are also recognized at our closing day Awards Luncheon.

The success of the annual LGA Program is wholly dependent on the enthusiasm of all of the women who show up each Thursday to play, as well as the personal commitment of our officers and volunteers for committees, our tournament chairs and their committees. It is my pleasure to carry on the work of all of our LGA past presidents who's vision has made the LGA the remarkable organization it is today and has been since its inception in 1991.
